A separate celebration was held for classes 1 and 2 at Maria Hall which highlighted the importance of the day.

A River's Cry and a Tree's Embrace

World Environment Day is not just a celebration of nature — it's a reminder of our duty to protect it.

Nature doesn't need us; we need nature. And this truth hits hard when we see our forests vanish, rivers polluted and animals silently suffering.

Take Kerala's Periyar River, a lifeline for lakhs of people. In 2018, scientists found microplastics in its waters, even inside the protected Periyar Tiger Reserve. Where did it come from? Everyday - plastic bags, wrappers, bottles - discarded carelessly in towns and pilgrimage centers. Over time, this plastic breaks down and harms aquatic life, entering the food chain.

A heart-wrenching example comes from Costa Rica, where a plastic straw was found lodged in a sea turtle's nose, causing pain and bleeding. This global plastic menace is also visible in our forests. Between 2001 and 2020, Kerala lost around 17,000 hectares of forest — weakening the land and worsening disasters like the 2018 floods.

But history reminds us that even small actions matter. In the 1970s, villagers in Uttarakhand sparked the Chipko Movement by hugging trees to protect them — a peaceful, powerful act led mostly by women.

On this Environment Day, let's take inspiration. Say no to single-use plastic, carry reusable bottles, plant trees and keep our surroundings clean. Let's be the voice for our rivers, the strength of our forests and the hug that protects a tree.

The time to care is now.







